




Thursday, April 21st



Macedonia Community Pride

Reminder that we are entering another mowing season, & it is the responsibility of each property owner to maintain their property in compliance with City Code.

<u>Cutting Grass/Weeds</u>—The owner or occupant of any premises shall mow grass & prevent the growth of weeds & other noxious growths upon any such premises & the parkings & alleys adjacent thereto before such grass/weeds & noxious growths become a breeding place for mosquitoes, or the harboring place of filthy deposits, so as to be dangerous to the health of the community.

Failure to maintain your yard & property in compliance with City Code will result in a legal notice to abate. The City will enforce Chapter 52.01 & if necessary abate the conditions at a cost to the owner. Maintaining your yard & property shows pride in our Community!

Junk Vehicle—A vehicle is considered a junk vehicle if it cannot be move under its own power or has not been used as an operating vehicle for a period of thirty (30) days or more. If you want to keep the vehicle, it must be stored in a garage or other enclosed structure. Comments to the Council Members are welcomed.



- -Earth Day always falls on April 22nd & is recognized globally.
- -Cardboard & Tin Recycling Trailers are parked behind the Stempel Bird Museum in a monthly rotation, & curbside recycling is available every other Thursday. See dates above.

Invoices are mailed out on the 1st of each month, and payment is due on the 25th. A \$10 late fee with be applied if payment is not received by the due date.
